NIGERIA, NIGERIANS AND NIGERIAN-CANADIANS

Nigeria has a population of roughly 230 million. It is a multinational state inhabited by more than 250 ethnic groups speaking about 500 distinct languages. Nigeria's official language is English – a language chosen to facilitate linguistic unity at the national level.



Apart from being the largest country in Africa, the largest black nation on earth, and the 6th most populous country in the world, Nigeria has a diaspora that is unique and outstanding. In the United States (as is typical in most countries of the Western world), Nigerians are among the best educated and most successful migrant groups in the United States.

As of 2022, Nigeria was Canada's fourth top immigration source country, welcoming 22,085 Nigerian immigrants, making up 5.05% of Canada's total number of permanent residents. Presently, there are over 200,000 Canadians of Nigerian descent. Nigerians constituted the top 4 top ten origin countries of study permit holders with a valid permit in Canada in 2022.

The annual NaijaFest event is a collaborative enterprise of all Nigerian ethnic groups registered in British Columbia. It is an event that showcases the rich cultural heritage of Nigerians in BC and invites all Canadians to enjoy the most delicious cuisines, most colorful costumes and the most vibrant music (and Afrobeat) in the world – which are all made in Nigeria.

On behalf of the over 20,000 Nigerian-Canadians who live, work and study in the province, I welcome you to NaijaFest 2024.

As a guest, please feel free to taste our food, wear our clothes, buy our artifacts and dance to our rhythmic Afrobeat and highlife music! For the 2 days that the event would last, we are all Naija people!

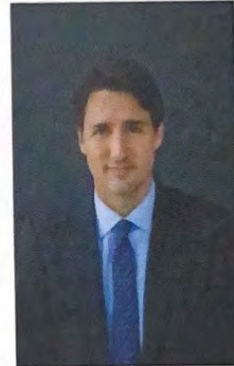

Nollywood Films are fast becoming a major attraction at the annual Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF) in Canada. The High Commission held a reception in honor of Nollywood delegates to the last festival in 2022. This delegation had not just come for the traditional movie screenings, but to explore prospects for business-to-business collaboration with their Canadian counterparts.

The immediate past Vice President of Nigeria, Professor Yemi Osinbajo SAN, GCON was at the screening of a Nollywood movie (2Weeks in Lagos) by a Nigerian Canadian filmmaker, Kathrine Fasegha. He was the special guest of honour at this screening that took place in Ottawa during his official working visit to Canada in November 2022.

All the efforts of Nigerian Canadian Associations, such as the NCABC, geared towards promoting Nigeria's rich cultural heritage are well appreciated and they serve to reinforce the cultural diplomacy initiatives being undertaken by the Nigeria High Commission in Ottawa. 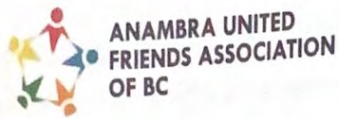

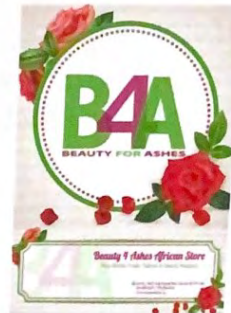

ABOUT:

ANIOMA people of DELTA STATE, NIGERIA - NDI ANIOMA

The Anioma people are a predominantly Igboid speaking ethnolinguistic group located in present day Delta State, Nigeria. As Anioma is also an acronym derived from the regions that make up the Western Igbo area: Aniocha (A), Ndokwa (N), Ika (I) and Oshimili (O), the coinage was made by the founding father of the Anioma state movement (which has spanned for over 50 years), Chief Dennis Osadebay in 1951 and has since remained the preferred indigenous name by which the people collectively refer to themselves.

The Anioma people encompass and are native to communities which span the 9 northern Local Government Areas of Delta State. Politically, the Anioma occupy the Delta North Senatorial District, where they are the majority. They are historically known to be a diverse group of Igbo speaking communities indigenous to the northern half of Delta State.

GEOGRAPHY:

The Anioma are located immediately south of the Edo Central Plains on the floodplains and hills of the western basin of the Niger River within the present Delta State of Nigeria. The homeland of the Anioma encompasses a land mass of about 6,300 km² [citation needed]. Politically, Anioma is often referred to in state affairs as Delta North, as in line with the people of the Delta South and Delta Central senatorial districts within Delta
